

Dr. Harrie Jonkman studied sociology and educational studies and worked at the University of Groningen, in education, the National Committee 4 and 5 May and the Dutch Youth Institute (NJI). Since 2008, he joined the Verwey-Jonker Institute. His work focuses on the social and cognitive development of children and young people, social determinants and prevention of health, developmental and behavioral problems. In 2012 he received from the National Institute on Drug Abuse (USA) a scholarship as 'Distinguished Researcher'. He was national project leader of the Community that Care strategy in the Netherlands, supported this also in other countries and wrote his PhD study into the effects of the prevention strategy Communities that Care. At the Verwey-Jonker Institute he is involved in experiments and evaluations of social programs, longitudinal studies, and international comparative studies. He supports prevention work in different countries, was advisor of the International Task Force on Prevention of the Society of Prevention Research and worked over decades as a supervisor in steering committees of educational institutes.
